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
1491: The Untold Story of the Americas is a docu-drama mini-series that brings to life the complexity, diversity and interconnectedness of Indigenous peoples in the Americas before the arrival of Columbus. Presented from an Indigenous-perspective through a blend of documentary and scripted drama, the series takes its audience on a journey along a timeline that dates from 20,000 years ago to 1491.

Over the course of eight hours, the origins and history of ancient Indigenous societies in North, Central and South America will be interpreted by leading Indigenous scholars and cultural leaders in the fields of archaeology, art history, ethnology, genetics, geology, linguistics, etc.

Each episode features a short scripted dramatic scene that portrays a significant moment in the history of one Indigenous nation. These theatrical-style scenes will establish the episode's theme and provide the audience with a deeper understanding of convergence of the human and natural worlds of Indigenous peoples.

The narrator for the series is Dr. Evan Adams, a First Nations actor and medical doctor. Dr. Adams introduces each episode and provides voice over narration throughout the program.

Each episode will feature eight distinct documentary segments presented through a combination of interviews with prominent Indigenous interpreters and dramatic re-creations that expand on the theme of the episode.



The series is based on the book: "1491: New Revelations of the Americas Before Columbus" by Charles C. Mann (Knopf, 2005).



Indigenous creation stories will be explored as well as key discoveries by archaeologists, anthropologists, geneticists and linguists on how and when Indigenous people first arrived in the Western Hemisphere. *Includes: Origin Stories, Ocean Arrival, Clovis Tools, Indigenous Languages, Population, Indigenous Archaeology, and Genetics.*

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ENVIRONMENT

AGRICULTURE AND HUNTING

The Neolithic era began more than 10,000 years ago in Mesoamerica with the cultivation of maize. Crops like sweet potatoes, beans and cacao were cultivated and spread throughout the Americas through trade networks. *Includes: Agriculture and Hunting, Maize, Potatoes, Agroforestry, Camas, Seal Hunting, Whaling, Buffalo Hunting, and the Salmon Run.*

ARCHITECTURE AND URBAN DESIGN


