Viola Desmond: GeoMinute

2021 1:00 min Canadian Geographic Enterprises On November 8, 1946, Black Halifax business owner Viola Desmond made a stand against racial segregation in Canada by refusing to leave the Whites-only section of a New Glasgow, N.S. movie theatre. She took her appeal to the Nova Scotia Supreme Court and became an iconic figure of Canada's civil rights movement. Seventy-five years later, Desmond's courage continues to be honoured and remembered by her appearance on Canada's \$10 bank note.

Lying nearly forgotten in a grove of trees at the back of a farmer's field is an old cemetery, long abandoned and poorly maintained. The cemetery should hold a special importance to the people of Canfield, a small village in southern Ontario, as the last physical evidence of a significant community of freedom seekers who arrived there on the Underground Railroad in the mid-1800s. Canfield Roots portrays the front-line efforts to preserve history before it's lost and the emotional, human connections over the generations from our ancestors to the present day. The series shares some of the stories of the Black families who made Canfield their home.

Expelled: My Roots in Uganda with Omar Sachedina

Fifty years after his mother and thousands of other Indians were expelled from the only home they had known in Uganda, CTV's Chief News Anchor and Senior Editor Omar Sachedina takes viewers on an intimate journey back to where his mother was born. The documentary follows Sachedina as he travels to his family's homeland of Uganda alongside his mother Salma and sister Nafilia, marking the first time his mother has returned since her expulsion in 1972.

GeoMinutes - Welcome to Canada - Canada Welcomes Ugandan Asian Refugees

1961, the Road to Freedom

The film follows the historic movement begun on May 4th, 1961 by a group of black and white civil rights activists, the so called "Freedom Riders" who launched a series interstate bus trips into the deep South to desegregate travel facilities. Brutally attacked, they eventually challenged the federal government's inaction to reverse decades of segregation and provide equality for all.

1— Hip Hop

Exploring Canadian Hip Hop's beginnings from Michie Mee and Maestro to Drake and in the process uncovering a rich history of cultural activism.

2 — Toronto Carnival

Every year over 2 million people celebrate Toronto Carnival but not everyone knows there are hidden messages in the revelry.

3 — Photography

This episode discusses the complexity of the Black gaze with renowned photographers and curators.

4 — Literature

We explore Black Canadian literature and how it intersects with immigration from the Caribbean and Africa.



5 — Archivists

In this episode, we uncover what motivates members of the Black Canadian community to archive Black history.
