The Water Walker

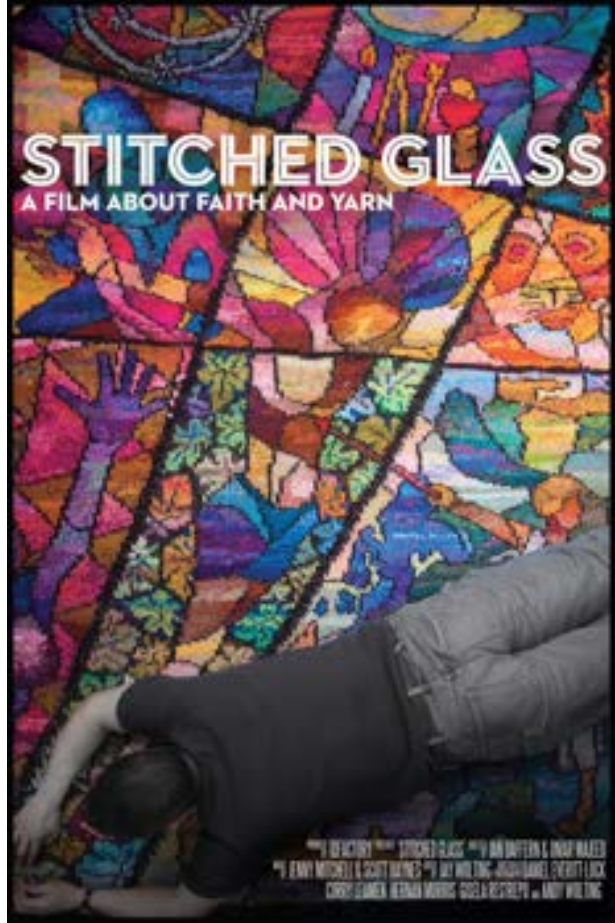
Starring Autumn Peltier, narrated by Graham Greene.

The Water Walker from Seeing Red 6Nations, an Indigenous-owned media company based on Six Nations of the Grand River Territory. It stars teenaged climate activist Autumn Peltier (Anishinaabe-kwe, Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory). The film is narrated by Academy Award-nominated actor Graham Greene (Oneida, Six Nations of the Grand River Territory (Ontario).

The Water Walker is a short documentary, tracing the roots, passion and perseverance of young Autumn. We follow her story as she prepares to speak at the United Nations. Autumn is an influential figure in the Indigenous and global youth-led environmental movement. In 2019, 14-year-old Autumn was named the chief water commissioner by the Anishinabek Nation, a position previously held by her late Great Aunt Josephine Mandamin, an elder and founding member of the water protectors movement.

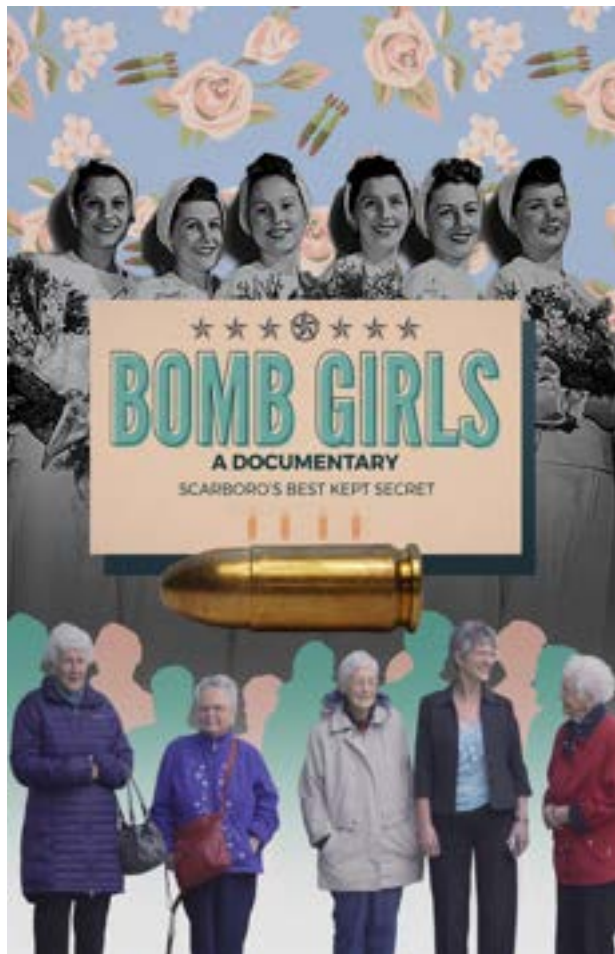
Stitched Glass: A Film about Faith and Yarn

After 15 years of intricate work, Kirk unveiled his tapestries at the Aga Khan museum in Toronto. *Stitched Glass* follows an artist confronted with the immensity of spiritual themes and shows how even the grandest concepts start with just one stitch. 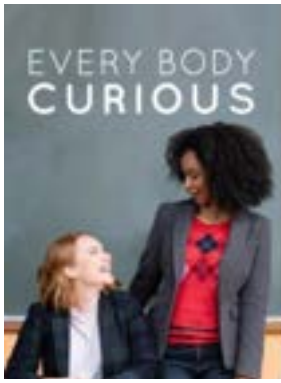
Bomb Girls: A Documentary

Actual war-time footage of the Scarborough plant's construction, its secretive tunnel system, and dangerous fuse-filling operations are portrayed. The story offers a softer, more light-hearted story, a welcome respite from the heaviness that can accompany a traditional war-time documentary.

Together with her diverse family of foster children, Auntie B has built a home where everyone can be themselves and explore what makes them special. She helps each of her children stay connected to their diverse cultural backgrounds and by doing so, encourages kids at home to accept each other for who they are, celebrate their differences, and learn that families come in many different forms.

Auntie B's House explores issues such as parental visits, social worker drop-ins and unique worries like whether the tooth fairy will be able to find foster kids in their new homes.

Joe Silvey was born and raised on Portugal's Atlantic Azores Islands, though after several adventures, Joe found himself on the Pacific coast, an early pioneer of Vancouver's Gastown. The sculpture honours the link between Portuguese and Coast Salish First Nations cultures, marks the land's rich heritage, and symbolizes unity for Vancouver's present-day diverse inhabitants. "My work is a reflection of the respect I feel for the master carvers of long ago", says Marston.

It takes viewers back in time with six Indigenous Adventurers embarking on the journey of a lifetime, surviving 25 days on the land, paddling three birchbark canoes through the vast territory known to the Lnu'k (Mi'kmaq) people as Kespukwilt (Lands End), also called Southern Nova Scotia.

Following old waterway trade routes used by Lnu'k, the Adventurers begin with only a few necessary tools and a limited supply of dried food. From day one they begin to decolonize, needing to rely on cultural teachings, each other, and the land to reach the end of their journey. During their adventure through various camps on winding rivers and secluded lakes, they meet Lnu Elders and Knowledge Holders who share culture, language, and traditional teachings to help them complete their journey and reconnect to who they are as Indigenous people.

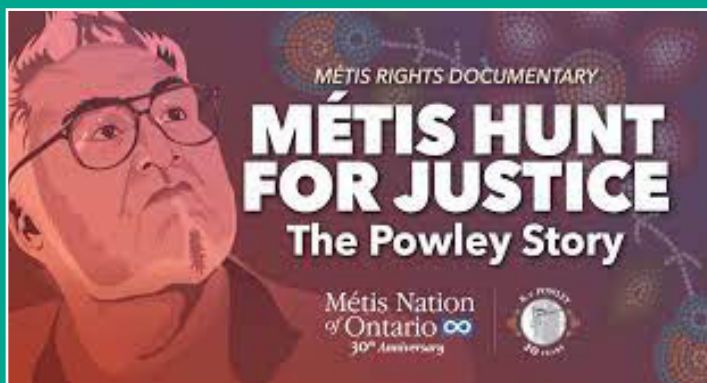
