


SHAKE HANDS WITH THE DEVIL: THE JOURNEY OF ROMÉO DALLAIRE






VOICES FROM THE FIRE





After killing 22 enemy soldiers in 48 hours, he returned home with severe, undiagnosed PTSD and was institutionalized. The government later tried to deport him under policies targeting non-naturalized wounded veterans, but he ultimately prevailed and went on to work on Parliament Hill in the 1940s.






HOME: THE COMPLICATED AND HUMAN STORIES OF HOMELESSNESS








MARGARET ATWOOD: A WORD AFTER WORD AFTER A WORD IS POWER




WINDS OF HEAVEN: EMILY CARR, CARVERS AND THE SPIRIT OF THE FOREST




PAINTED LAND: IN SEARCH OF THE GROUP OF SEVEN




RICHARD HENRIQUEZ: BUILDING STORIES






MANUFACTURING THE THREAT




GRANDDAUGHTER'S SONG
